

The Hourglass block was fun to make simple cuts—then shuffle the fabrics between the units for a new, more interesting design. The Pinwheel units that form when pieced together add a lot of movement to the quilt design.

Plan

With just a bundle of coordinating 10" squares and a white print—plus the wave of your magic rotary cutter-you can create this fun, disappearing block quilt in no time. We suggest using a design wall to organize the units and patches for a pleasing color arrangement before assembling the blocks and quilt top.

Use an accurate 1/4" seam allowance throughout to ensure all elements of the quilt fit together well.

Shop

Fabric yardage assumes 40" usable width of fabric (WOF) unless otherwise noted.

- White print 31/8 yds. for blocks and border
- Assorted prints in blues, greens, teals, and golds 2¼ yds. total OR 36 (10") squares for blocks
- Teal print 34 yd. for binding
- Backing 4¼ yds.
- Batting 70" × 78"

Cut

Patches are lettered in order of use. Measurements include ¼" seam allowances. Border strips will be pieced and cut to exact length needed. You may want to make them longer to allow for piecing variations.

- White print 7 strips 1½" × WOF for border 36 squares 10" (A)
- Assorted prints in blues, greens, teals, and golds cut a total of: 36 squares 10" (A)
- Teal print 8 strips 2½" × WOF for binding

NOTE: Fabrics in the quilt shown are Home Town designed by Lori Holt of Bee in my Bonnet for Riley Blake Designs.



Sew


1. Referring to Quick-Pieced Hourglass Units in Sew Easy Lessons, use white print A's with assorted print A's to make 72 unit 1's (Diagram I).

2. Measuring 2½" away from the center of unit 1 as shown in Diagram II, carefully cut from the right side. Without disturbing the cut pieces, rotate unit 1 and cut remaining 3 sides in the same way to make a set of 1 unit 2, 4 unit 3's, 2 white B's, and 2 assorted print B's. Cut each unit 1 in the same way.





3. Referring to Diagram III, arrange a set of 1 unit 2 and 4 matching unit 3's, 2 white B's, plus 2 matching color B's from a different set as shown. Sew the units and B's together to make a block. Center and trim the block to 8". Repeat to make 72 blocks total.

Tracy's Top Tip: A rotating cutting

mat—or a small mat you can turn after each cut—is a handy tool for making disappearing blocks.

NOTE: Refer to **Assembly** Diagram for following steps, watching block orientations.


- 4. Sew 9 rows of 8 blocks each as shown. Join the rows together.
- 5. Join white border strips and cut to sizes shown in Assembly Diagram. Matching centers and ends, sew border side strips to quilt. Repeat to add border top and bottom strips.
- 6. Layer, baste, and quilt. Becky machine quilted a Baptist Fan motif across the quilt surface. Bind the quilt.
